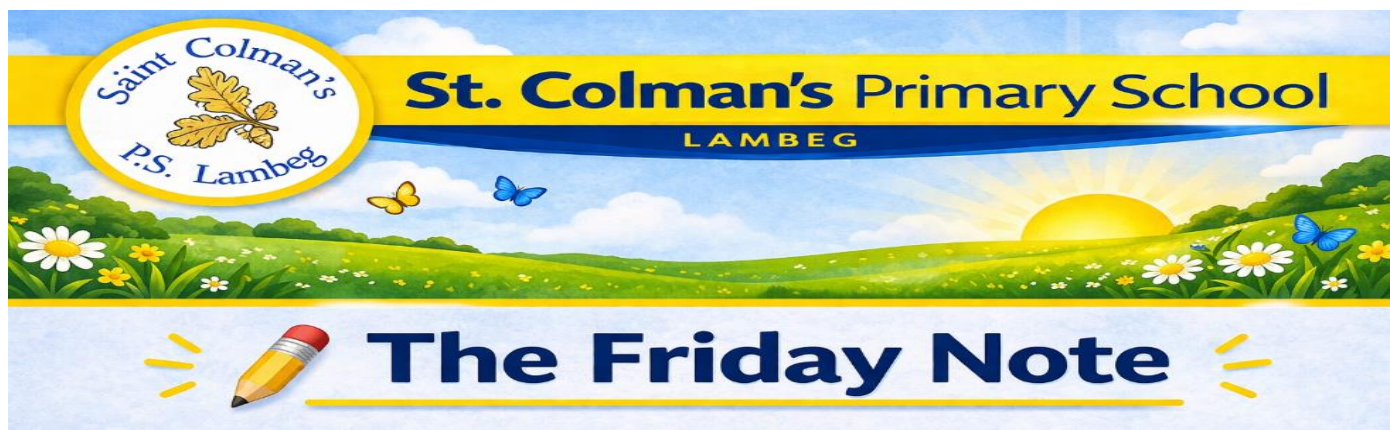




Friday 26th June 2026
